



#### ALCA Ranking Policy for ILCA World Masters Championships

Entry ranking for the ILCA World Masters Championships will be based on placings in each age division at the preceding Australian ILCA Masters Championships. However, current World Masters Champions will be ranked ahead of all others, ordered by age if necessary.

ILCA requires a single ranking list for each class (ILCA 6 and ILCA 7), regardless of age division. Rankings will use a 100-point system similar to World Sailing's: sailors earn points based on the number of competitors in their age division and their placing (e.g., in a 100-sailor division, first place earns 100 points, second 99, and so on). Points are scaled for smaller divisions (e.g., in a 50-sailor division, first place earns 100, second 98, etc.).

WA Region sailors unable to attend the Australian ILCA Masters may request ranking based on their scaled results from the preceding WA Region Masters Championship.

Sailors who did not compete in the Australian ILCA Masters will be ranked after all others, in order of their application to ILCA.

This policy replaced the July 2017 policy ongoing from ranking for 2023 ILCA World Championships.
